Business Rates Rises Threatening the UK Music Industry

We are writing to you as a group of Labour MPs to urge you to look again at the business rates regime for venues and studios in the music industry.

The UK Music industry is one of our most important cultural and economic assets, delivering world-renowned artists, venues, festival, studios and generating significant international soft power. In 2024, it contributed £8 billion to the economy.

Music venues and recording studios are vital to this success, forming the critical and irreplaceable infrastructure that underpins the sector, and embeds music within communities.

This government has rightly identified music as a key growth sector in its Creative Industries Sector Plan, and the £30 million Music Growth Package shows that this government is serious about supporting and growing the sector.

However, many of us have been contacted by constituents in recent months who use and run these critical music spaces, explaining that they will be severely impacted by the 2026 business rates revaluation, scheduled to take effect on 1 April 2026.

According to the Music Venue Trust, 84 grassroots music venues in England face rateable value increases of between 45% and 275% from 2025/26 to 2026/27. These increases do not represent marginal adjustments but existential threats.

Recording studios, will also be heavily affected, with the Music Producers Guild (MPG) citing average increase of 45%, and some studios looking at increases in excess of 90%, and one reporting an increase of over 400%.

A recent MPG survey showed that 100% of studios questioned were unable to pass on any cost increases to their clients, and 50% are considering closing in the next year.

In addition, recording studios face the further challenge of being excluded from the new lower Retail, Hospitality and Leisure (RHL) business rates multiplier that also comes into effect on April 1st. This is despite studios playing a comparable role pubs and venues in providing public-facing services and generating local economic activity and employment. Their exclusion further compounds the financial pressures created by the revaluation.

These increases pose a serious threat to the UK's music sector. The current business rates valuation system does not reflect the economic realities of music venues and recording studios.

We are therefore asking you to pause the implementation of the new rateable values on these spaces and work with the sector to develop a valuation methodology that more accurately reflects how they operate.

In addition, recording studios must be included in the RHL business rates multiplier so that they do not face the combined impact of higher rateable values and exclusion from the reduced rates multiplier.
